Investment

The government and private sector have invested trillions of dollars into innovative industries that use standards. Standard-essential patent (SEP) abuse puts these investments at risk.

Final Product

When owners of SEPs engage in abusive and anti-competitive practices by threatening injunctions, hard-working American innovators are forced to choose — do they pay exorbitant royalty rates or pull their products off the shelves? Either way, American consumers lose through increased prices and fewer product options.



Development

When abusive SEP holders demand excessive, non-FRAND royalties or refuse to license, small and medium businesses are hurt the most. Businesses must limit product offerings, adopt inferior technologies, or spend significant time and money developing workarounds.
